Professor Martyn Barrett is Emeritus Professor of Psychology at the University of Surrey, UK. He obtained his degrees from the Universities of Cambridge and Sussex. He is a developmental and social psychologist but has a strong commitment to multidisciplinary research and works with educationalists, political scientists, sociologists and policy analysts. His primary research interests are focused on young people, race, ethnicity and nation and the societal challenges that arise from cultural diversity. He is particularly interested in the development of intercultural and global competence, and the development of political cognition, civic attitudes and active citizenship. He is currently leading a flagship project for the Council of Europe that is producing a European reference framework of the competences that young people require to participate effectively in democratic culture. He is also working with the OECD PISA team developing the conceptual framework and assessments of global competence for PISA 2018.
